

The procedure involves using a catheter to insert a stent, which opens up clogged blood vessels in the heart. The project had been long desired by local healthcare professionals, and was clearly needed to keep patients local for essential and lifesaving care.

Before cardiac stenting was introduced, the catheterization lab was running four days a week. The lab was only used to diagnose cardiac issues before sending patients to another centre for the stenting procedure.

Since their first stenting procedure, the lab has expanded to offer services five days a week, and has kept over 300 patients in Sault Ste. Marie for care. Many of these stenting procedures were planned and scheduled to proactively open blockages before they lead to further health issues.

Some, however, were emergencies. For those cases, if cardiac stenting services had not been available here, the outcome could have been very different for these patients.

This program is only possible because of the support of our community. The program would never have grown

to where it is now, and would not have impacted so many lives, without the donations in support of the expansion.

While so many stepped up to make this program possible, a special thank you to Dale Harrison, the Lou and Mae Lukenda Charitable Foundation, and the Sault Area Hospital Volunteer Association for their generous gifts to this program.

Over the next few years, the Cardiac Care Program is working toward opening a second catheterization lab, recruiting a full-time interventional cardiologist, and offering the service 24/7.
